Registering specialist clinics (Telehealth)

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Non Admitted Clinic Management System (NACMS)

Introduction

- To comply with the requirements under the National Health Reform Agreement (NHRA):
 - Victorian health services classify non-admitted clinics into the most appropriate Tier 2 classification
 - All ABF and Small Rural Health Services (SRHS) must register nonadmitted clinics with the Department of Health and Human Services.
- The mechanism for registering non-admitted clinics is via the HealthCollect portal on the Non-Admitted Clinic Management System (NACMS).

Non Admitted Clinic Management System (NACMS)

Scope

- Health services funded under Activity Based Funding (ABF) must register all acute non admitted (specialist outpatient) clinics.
- Clinics should be registered against the health service campus where the activity occurs.
 - This includes both public and MBS funded clinics.

Non Admitted Clinic Management System (NACMS)

Not in Scope

- Clinics that don't meet the definition of a non-admitted service event
- Private clinics operated on a completely private basis where the medical record is not held by the health service, these clinics do not attract ABF funding.
- Primary Care, HITH, HACC, Health Promotion Activity
- Care planning/coordination where patient is not present.

Note: This list is not exhaustive.

Definition of Non-Admitted Patient Service Event

The non-admitted patient service event is used to count health care services delivered in the non-admitted sector of the public health system.

A non-admitted patient service event is defined as:

An interaction between one or more health care provider(s) with one non-admitted patient, which must contain therapeutic/clinical content and result in a dated entry in the patient's medical record.

The interaction may be for assessment, examination, consultation, treatment and or education.

Tier 2 Classification - Non-admitted Clinics

Tier 2 is a classification system specifically for non-admitted services. It has been used since 2012-13 and Victorian specialist clinics are registered against specific Tier 2 classes.

There are 2 specific Tier 2 Classes that are used for Telehealth:

20.55 (Telehealth – Patient Location) Medical Consultation 40.61 (Telehealth – Patient Location) Allied Health and/or clinical nurse specialist interventions.

Telehealth Consultations (Non-admitted Patient)

Reporting

Interactions that meet the definition of a service event are in scope for reporting on the

- AIMS S10 form and
- VINAH (Victorian Integrated Non-Admitted Health)

Consultations delivered via Information and Communication Technology (ICT) (including but not limited to Telehealth where the patient is participating via a video link) must be equivalent to a face to face consultation to be counted as a non admitted service event.

Consultations delivered via ICT must be a direct substitute for a face to face consultation to be counted. The consultation must contain therapeutic/clinical content and be equivalent in content in the sense that if the consultation could not be provided via ICT, a face to face consultation would have occurred.

Telehealth Consultations (Non-admitted Patient)

Reporting

Consultations delivered via Telehealth involving multiple public hospitals can be reported by both hospitals i.e. the hospital providing the consultation and the hospital where the patient physically attends.

Hospital A:

The health service providing the specialist clinic consultation should report the service event to the appropriate clinic specialty ie. Tier 2 (20.34) - Endocrinology

Hospital B:

The hospital where the patient physically attends to receive telehealth consultation reports the service event against to one of the following Tier 2 class based on the health professional present with the patient: -

20.55 (Telehealth – Patient Location) - Patient with Dr/Nurse Practitioner

40.61 (Telehealth – Patient Location) - nurse/allied health professional.

Example - Telehealth Reporting

Hospital A - Nurse with non-admitted patient for Consultation via Telehealth



Reporting = One Service event for Nurse Consultation

Tier 2 - 40.61 (Telehealth - Patient location)

Hospital B - Neurologist - Non-admitted Consultation via Telehealth



Reporting = One Service event for Medical Consultation

Tier 2 - 20.15 (Neurology) Clinic

During an outpatient visit involving an elderly patient at Hospital A, a neurologist in Hospital B assesses tremors and gait problems using teleconferencing. A nurse is with the patient during the outpatient visit at Hospital A. Hospital B has determined the clinic providing the service is most appropriately classified to 20.15 (Neurology).

Outcome: this consultation is equivalent to the patient attending an appointment in person with the Neurologist at hospital B. It meets the definition of a non-admitted patient service event and is counted as a non-admitted patient service event for the clinic at Hospital B in the class 20.15 (Neurology) and for hospital A in the class 40.61 Telehealth-patient location.

Telehealth Consultations (Non-admitted Patient) Clinic Registration


A clinic providing specialist consultation via telehealth should be assigned to the appropriate Tier 2 classification that reflects the clinic's specialisation.

For example:


A Haematologist providing a medical consultation to a patient via telehealth at home should be reported as a service event to a clinic which is classified to 20.10 (Haematology).

This interaction can be counted as one service event by the health service providing the Telehealth consultation. An additional service event cannot be reported as the patient is at home not another health service.
